In the context of contemporary globalization, East Asia has brought to the fore issues regarding cultural, economic and social inequality which are challenging its modern education systems. To answer these shared challenges, East Asian societies should make efforts together to nurture educational professionals who have international and multiple perspectives and are able to improve East Asian education systems in a sustainable way. Asia Education Leader (AEL) Course is one of such efforts.

AEL Course aims to nurture internationally minded educational professionals (IMEP) who have international perspective and are able to address educational challenges in contemporary East Asia.

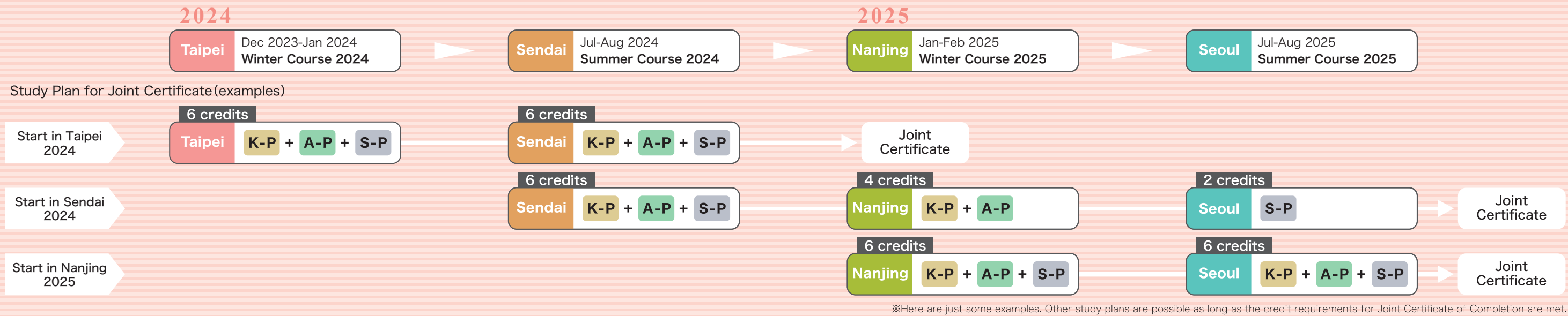
AEL Course is set up by consensus among, and its summer/winter courses are hosted in turn by, six partner institutes of five universities in East Asia. They are

- Graduate School of Education, **Tohoku University** (TU), Sendai
- College of Education, **National Chengchi University** (NCCU), Taipei
- School of Education Science, **Nanjing Normal University** (NNU), Nanjing
- School of Psychology, **Nanjing Normal University** (NNU), Nanjing
- Department of Education, **Korea University** (KU), Seoul
- College of Education, **National Taiwan Normal University** (NTNU), Taipei

The people we nurture are

- **Education researchers** capable of undertaking comparative analysis of educational issues in East Asia
- **Teacher leaders** who are practicing educators capable of engaging with researchers, policymakers and other practitioners
- **Education administrators** with the knowledge and skills required to collaborate with partners across the region

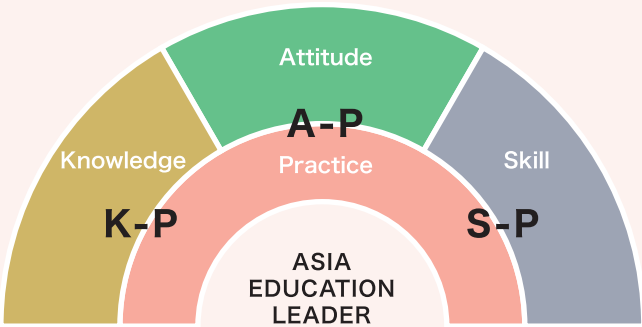
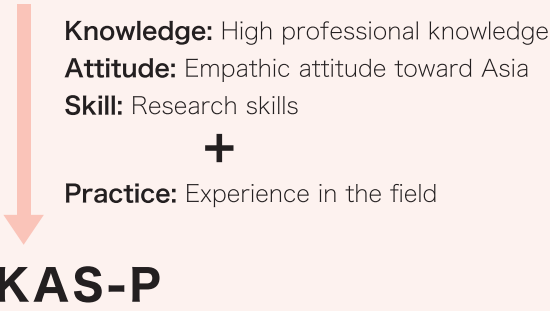

JOINT CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION

Jointly issued by the six partner institutes, the Joint Certificate of Completion is awarded to students who have earned at least 12 credits, among which 6 credits are not from home university and at least 2 credits are from K-P, A-P and S-P subjects respectively.
