Emphasizing contextual diversity, the course examines how education is designed and implemented in response to different social, cultural, economic, and technological environments.</p> <p>Key themes include designing education for diverse contexts, innovation for inclusive and quality education, pedagogical and learning design, and educational leadership in the age of artificial intelligence (AI). Through lectures, fieldwork, and collaborative activities, students will engage with real-world educational settings in Thailand and critically reflect on similarities and differences across countries.</p> <p>The course aims to develop students' analytical, comparative, and reflective skills, enabling them to understand educational issues from multiple perspectives and apply insights to their own contexts.</p> | | | | |
