# Advanced Registration for Graduate School Course Subjects

Following the "Agreement on Advanced Registration for Graduate Course Subjects," the Graduate School of Education will allow fourth-year undergraduate students who wish to enroll in some courses of the Graduate School of Education (only those approved by the Graduate School) to enroll in such course subjects. Fourth-year undergraduate students who wish to take courses at the Graduate School of Education are required to apply as follows: Please note that graduate school courses taken in advance cannot be recognized as undergraduate credits. (For more information, please refer to the "Agreement on Advanced registration of Graduate course subjects.")

1. Advanced registration for graduate course subjects offered by the Graduate School of Education will be announced in April of each academic year. (Course subjects offered in 2026 are as shown in the attachment.)
2. Fourth-year students who wish to take advanced courses must submit the "Application for Advanced Registration (Form 1)" to the Educational Affairs Section of the Faculty of Education by the course registration period of each semester. The course instructor's and academic advisor's opinions must be included in the application. (For 2026, the submission deadline is April 21 (Tue) for first-semester courses and October 14 (Wed) for second-semester courses.)
3. Only those who have been approved by the Graduate School of Education as beneficial to their education and research will be allowed to take an advanced course. Please note that even if you apply for advance registration, you may not be allowed to register for the course. We will notify students who have been granted permission for advanced registration (advanced registration students). (The first semester is scheduled for mid-May and the second semester is for mid-November.)
4. Credits earned through advanced registration cannot be recognized as undergraduate credits. Only when an advanced registration student enters the Graduate School of Education (Graduate School), up to 15 credits may be recognized as credits earned in the Graduate School of Education (Graduate School). However, students who wish to re-register for courses that have already been approved as credits after entering the graduate school must follow a procedure after entering the graduate school.
